FACT SHEET HB 3498 (Conroy)

- Telehealth authorization legislation, HB 3498 codifies Governor Pritzker's March 19, 2020 telehealth executive order, but the Executive Order (E.O.) and the bill exclude approximately 4,100 Illinois licensed dietitian nutritionists.
- Of the approximately 4,100 Illinois licensed dietitian nutritionists, 90% are women.
- Last March, BlueCross BlueShield, for example, did voluntarily include dietitian nutritionists in their coverage.
- ► A March 19 BCBS "alert" explicitly cited the governor's E.O. to justify the extension of coverage to dietitian nutritionists.
- Despite an appeal from the Illinois Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics in April 2020, the governor's office declined to update the E.O.
- ► The Illinois Hospital Association's telehealth coalition's official position on HB3498 is to limit the covered health professionals to only those in the governor's original E.O.
- ▶ If HB 3498 becomes law, it could end up stripping existing coverage from more than 4,100 dietitian nutritionists.
- Meanwhile, dietitian nutritionists were recognized in the recently approved Black Caucus health care pillar legislation, HB158 (Lilly), as health care professionals.
- ► The federal Medicare program added dietitian nutritionists to the list of practitioners that may provide telehealth services in 2006.
- The Illinois Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics has presented a six-word amendment to Representative Deb Conroy that would include approximately 4,100 Illinois licensed dietitian nutritionists in HB3498.
- Including licensed dietitian nutritionists in the telehealth legislation would assure continuous access to safe, effective nutrition services that can improve the health of Illinois citizens.
