
Through her fellowship, she is working with the Academy's RISA team to lead research that is evaluating barriers to food security among Muslim college students; the impact of food and nutrition insecurity on health and well-being of Muslim college students; inventory of halal food options on campuses; and potential cost-effective solutions to reduce food and nutrition insecurity among Muslim college students.

Dr. Shaikh is the recipient of two NIH Fogarty Global Health Fellowships and completed her post-doctoral training in nutrition and chronic disease at Emory University. Her research interests focus on the intersection between nutrition, food insecurity and chronic diseases and in developing and evaluating dietary assessment instruments to assess shifts in diets following globalization and development. When she is not working, you can find her reading and doing jigsaw puzzles. She lives in Atlanta with her husband and son.



Allene Vaden Memorial Grant for Foodservice Management Research Grant amount: \$5,000	This grant is given to encourage young academics to enhance and stimulate research in foodservice management.
Amy Joye Memorial Research Award Grant amount: \$5,000	Applicants are required to work with a mentor whose projects involve human research and focus on: Dietary assessment methodology to investigate/enhance accuracy of dietary reports*, Obesity prevention/weight control, or Fruit/vegetable gardens.
	*Accuracy of dietary reports requires validation or comparison of dietary reports by study participants to actual dietary intake. Such validation does not simply compare two self-report methods by study participants because with that study design, actual dietary intake is unknown. Instead, validation requires comparison of dietary reports by study participants to a method that does not rely on another self-report method by study participants.
Ann A. Hertzler Memorial Research Grant Grant amount: \$15,000	2024 Topic: Proposals should investigate ambulatory RDN staffing ratios to support medical nutrition therapy and other nutrition services.
Colgate Palmolive Fellowship in Nutrition, Oral Health/ Dental Education Grant amount: \$15,000	This grant is given to support research in nutrition and oral health or dental education by doctoral students seeking a doctorate in nutrition and oral health or dental education, Masters thesis research on nutrition and oral health/disease or RDNs with advanced degrees doing research in the area of nutrition and oral health. Non-US residents may apply.
Commission on Dietetic Registration Emerging Researcher Grant Grant amount: \$10,000	This grant supports researchers with limited to no track records of extramural funding from competitive research grants and/or no first-authored, peer-reviewed research publications to conduct research that aligns with CDR's Strategic Plan,
Commission on Dietetic Registration Student-Faculty Collaborative Research Grant Grant amount: \$5,000	This grant supports faculty members or program directors of ACEND-accredited educational programs who oversee ongoing research within their programs that relates to COR's Strategic Plan and engages nutrition and dieteless students who are completing their eligibility requirements to take the registration examination for dietitians.
Diabetes (DDPG) DPG Karen Goldstein Memorial Grant for Diabetes MNT Application Grant amount: \$20,000. Available every other year.	This grant is given to provide financial support to a Diabetes DPG member for outcomes research in diabetes medical nutrition therapy.
Jean Hankin Nutritional Epidemiology Research Grant Grant amount: \$20,000	This grant is given to provide financial support to a doctoral student working on a dissertation in the area of nutritional epidemiology.
Julie O'Sullivan Maillet Research Grant Grant amount: \$1,000	This grant is given for a research project that aims to demonstrate the value of dietetics professionals on the health of the public or demonstrate the evolving role of dietetics professionals in the profession.
McCormick Science Institute Research Grant Grant amount: \$10,000	The purpose of the McCormick Science Institute Research Grant is to fund research that explores the potential health benefits of whole culinary herbs and spices; extracts are not allowed.
Molly Kellogg Grant for Advancement in Nutrition Counseling Grant amount: \$3,000	This grant is given to advance counseling skills excellence in the dietetic profession by providing financial support to RDs and DTRs to pursue research in the nutrition counseling process.
Vegetarian Nutrition Dietetic Practice Group Research Grant Grant amount: \$10,000	This grant is given for innovative research relating to vegetarian nutrition to an individual who is an RDN, DTR or Dietetic Student member of the Academy. Preference will be given to members of the Vegetarian Nutrition Dietetic Practice Group.
